Weekly Round Up

Pebbles

This week Pebbles have enjoyed lots of activities to help develop their fine motorskills. We drew different shapes in flour using different size paint brushes. They had fun threading beads onto pipecleaner flowers which were numbered with dots and numbers. The children were very clever putting the correct number of beads on each stem. We have enjoyed stencil painting, bracelet making and played dough disco. Outside we have loved getting 'mucky' in the mud kitchen making Gruffalo pies and our new dolls house was very popular.



Ladybirds

This week in Ladybirds our focus has been on rockets; we enjoyed watching them blasting off from a space station whilst finding out about the different jobs that they are used for. We all made our own rocket and then throughout the week have written instructions on how to make our rocket, making sure we used our bossy verbs.

In mathematics we have continued to work on our number bonds to 10 and found our own way to represent this. The focus has been on bonds to 10 in 2 parts for example 5 and 5 and in 3 parts 5 plus 2 and 3. We have also been looking at odd and even numbers to 10 and the patterns we can see in the numbers. We made odd and even aliens.

In phonics we have looked at longer words plus words ending in s but sounding like z and es endings which sound like iz endings eg boxes.



Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been looking at features of a recount. This week they have been learning to form past tense verbs by using the suffix -ed. They have also been learning about conjunctions such as 'and', 'but', 'because' and 'when' to link or extend their sentences.

In mathematics, Year 1 have been learning to find one more and one less than a given number within 50. They have also started their new unit on length and height. Year 2 have continued learning their times tables and have been learning to multiply and divide by 10 and 5.

In history the children have been analysing historical sources. This week the children looked at a map of London 1666 which showed the spread of the fire across 4 days. The children were able to identify the source, say when it was made and described what they could see using their knowledge from this term.

In computing, the children have continued to use Scratch Jr. This week, we learnt how to record sound effects using the recording block. The children then made animations to tell a joke.

Kestrel Class

In English this week, the children have had a recap of some of the grammar that we have been learning this term. We have started preparing for writing the innovation of our text next week. We have also done some reading assessments to work out what we may have found tricky so that we can continue improving our knowledge next term.

In mathematics, the Nemos have been recapping some of the more challenging topics from this term, including multiplication, division and fractions. The Frogs have finished their unit on decimals.

In music, the children continued using drums and were learning the 'elephant walk' to work on their rhythm. They also practised the song 'Kpann Logo' that has been a feature in classes this term to play two rhythms together.

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Osprey Class

Our week started with a challenge to create a mythical creature that was a mix of animals, we looked at minotaurs, centaurs and griffins before designing our own! Following this we accepted another challenge to help write a non-chronological report to help unicornologist Pie Corbett finish his book 'The Ultimate Guide to Unicorns & Flying Horses'. We have found out about various breeds of unicorns and flying horses and have started planning our reports. Did you know there are thunderhorn unicorns, ember unicorns, long whiskered flying horses and many more? I am looking forward to sharing some of these reports with you next week! Zog thoroughly enjoyed learning about the various breeds!



In mathematics, both year 5 and year 6 have started their statistics unit of work. They have looking at creating and interpreting line graphs.

As part of our Ancient Greek topic we have make amphoras, this was our second attempt as terracotta clay was not the best choice! This time we used stoneware clay to make our amphoras, we have developed our coil pot techniques and had a go at making handles!



Barn Owls

In English this week, the children have been using laptops to publish their discussion texts. They have also started creating their own posters about plastic pollution.

In mathematics, the children have been exploring capacity and volume. They have been measuring in litres and millilitres and have learned that there are 1000 millilitres in a litre.
