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## Weekly Round Up

### Pebbles

Pebbles have been enjoying making dotty finger painted flowers this week, they have spent time looking at and talking about the colours and patterns. They have been using buckets and piping to problem solve how to move water from one container to another.

They enjoyed playing Volcanoes and Craters and 'head, shoulders, knees and cones'

### Ladybirds

We have had another busy week in Ladybirds. This week we designed our own super villain vegetable and thought about what mischief they may get up to in the supermarket. We planned our own story and changed it from the evil pea to our new character. We then looked at writing the first part of our story, we will continue with the story next week. After our trip to Abundance Seedlings we have been planting some of our own vegetable seeds at school.

There was a special delivery at the end of week and we have been amazed how quickly our caterpillars are growing.

We looked at Vincent Van Gogh's painting of sunflowers really closely and painted our own. We have had lots of water play to help us keep cool in the heat!

In mathematics we have played games to help us understand odds and evens and doubles. We have been working on making repeating patterns and worked with a friend to guess their pattern rule.



### Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been planning their own letters of complaint from one of the crayons in 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. They have also started writing the opening of their letters and will continue writing these next week.

In mathematics, Year 1 have started learning about place value within 100. This week they have been counting forwards and backwards to 100 and identifying tens and ones in bigger numbers. Year 2 have finished their unit on fractions. This week they have been identifying and finding  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a shape or quantity.

In art this week, the children have started creating their own Van Gogh inspired pictures using oil pastel. The children have looked closely at the painting 'The Starry Night' and have used this to create their own piece using St Nicholas' Church as their stimulus.

In science, Woodland Class have been learning about parts of flowers and trees. The children made flowers using paper and labelled the key parts including petals, stem, leaves and roots. As a challenge some children were also able to label the parts of a tree and explained the importance of roots.

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## Kestrel Class

In English this week, the class have continued mapping the rest of our focus text and have made up actions to go with it. There has been some very enthusiastic retelling of the text with some super expression! We have also started looking at the persuasion toolkit; looking at the features and finding them within our focus text.



In mathematics, we have been doing our end of term assessments to see how much the children have retained through the units of fractions, decimals, money, time and shape. We have also continued looking at shape; Nemos have been learning about angles, whilst Frogs have been learning about quadrilaterals and polygons.

We were lucky on Thursday to spend the afternoon watching Cars. One of our Kestrels chose to spend their Ibstone Investments on a movie afternoon for the whole class! This is the second time that one of the Kestrels have gained enough points to share this treat with their whole class and everybody was very grateful. Kestrels have been very excited about the Ibstone Investments and their frequent reading at home has been earning them points to enjoy treats such as hot chocolate with a member of staff, extra playtime and a walk with Zog.

## Osprey Class

This week in English, Osprey Class have been busy learning their new text map: who is to blame for the tragedy in the Highwayman? We have also been applying our formal sentence starters to discuss whether Mrs Long should rent out the Astro to make money for the school. Finally, we have started reading Matthews and Ross's version of Macbeth to further explore blame in tragedies.

In mathematics this week we have been learning how to add and subtract decimals and the whole class have excelled! Y6 have been bringing together all they have learnt this year and applying their knowledge to complete a bakery themed project.

In D&T we have started making our waistcoats – this week has involved selecting fabric, carefully cutting out our patterns and clipping the pieces together ready for sewing.

One of the children also got to claim his Ibstone Investment reward – we had hot chocolate on the hottest day of the year!

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## Barn Owls

In English, we've continued our work on the persuasive text, 'Perfect Parrot for Sale.' Barn Owls did a fantastic job mapping out the story and practising their retelling skills, paying close attention to all the persuasive techniques used within the text.

In maths this week, it's been all about shapes! We've explored 2D and 3D shapes, learning about the important components of 3D figures such as **edges, vertices, and faces**. The children particularly enjoyed the challenge of using nets to construct their very own 3D shapes!
