### Weekly Round Up

#### Pebbles

This week Pebbles have been talking about gardens. They listened to the story 'Errol's Garden' about a little boy who loved plants and flowers but did not have a garden. With the help of his community, they made a beautiful communal garden on the roof of their flats for everyone to enjoy.

The children planted their own seeds and have enjoyed tending to them and watering them everyday. They have talked about their own gardens and have thought about all the things they enjoy doing in their gardens across the different seasons.

In dance they have been tiny little seeds that have grown into different coloured flowers, then they were the buzzy bees collecting pollen and nectar.



#### Ladybirds

This week we have worked hard each day to finish our own Supertato story. Thankfully sneaky aubergine, spying cabbage and angry carrot to name a few were all marched back to the freezer and the vegetables were safe at last!

When we arrived on Monday we were able to observe the change that had taken place with our caterpillars, the cocoons were moved safely into the butterfly house and we are all watching and waiting patiently to see the next change. We have made some pretty symmetrical butterfly paintings and used wooden loose parts to make butterflies.

In mathematics we have continued with our pattern work and looked at copying a model that our friend made making sure we had the tree, house person in the same place. We also looked at how perspective changes depending where you are looking at in a model.

In phonics we have continued to recap tricky words and looked at reading and writing words ending in ed but sounding like t, d or id.

## Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have finished writing their letters of complaint from the crayons in our Talk 4 Writing text. There were some very tired and angry crayons! They have also started to plan their persuasive letters to convince the crayons to come back to work which they will write next week.

In mathematics, Year 1 have continued learning about place value. This week they have been partitioning numbers into tens and ones and identifying one more and one less than a given number. Year 2 have started learning about time. This week they have recapped their knowledge of o'clock and half past and have started to learn about quarter past and quarter to.

In art, the children have worked very hard to complete their Van Gogh inspired pictures of St Nicholas' Church. This week, we focused on the grass and sky using broken lines to create the textured effect of Van Gogh's paintings.



In science, the children have been learning about deciduous and evergreen trees. The children enjoyed making books to show deciduous trees in different seasons and wrote sentences to explain what happens to different trees throughout the year. We also worked in small groups to plant beans.

### Kestrel Class

In English this week, we have been looking at the key vocabulary in our focus text and finding synonyms in a thesaurus. We have done some short burst writing to improve our sentences, using the synonyms to make the text even more exciting. We also created posters as adverts to persuade the reader to buy a new parrot from the pet shop.

In mathematics, Nemos have been recognising and describing 2D shapes and also learning how to draw polygons. Frogs have started their new unit on statistics and have been interpreting bar charts and pictograms. They also had a practical lesson on symmetry, using pin boards and Duplo to find the horizontal, vertical and diagonal lines of symmetry.



In Design and Technology, Kestrels have been drawing plans for how they will build their bridges. They have had to consider the materials they wish to use and label their designs. It was important to consider which style of bridge they would make as they needed to decide which would hold the most weight.

In French, we were singing songs to help us learn the numbers!

### Osprey Class

This week in English, Osprey Class have been working on developing their discussion toolkits. We have been practising using subjunctives, parenthesis and rhetorical questions to help structure our arguments. We have discussed many different topics such as: Should all school get school meals for free and should the timings of the school day should be 9:30-4:30?

In maths, Year 5 have been learning how to add and subtract decimals with different number of decimal places, using a variety of different techniques. Year 6 have been planning holidays and figuring out the costs involved in flights and accommodation. They have been working out the best value prices for their holiday of choice.

This week in PSHE we have been discussing online trolling and anonymous posting. We have had many insightful comments from the Osprey children around how to behave online. This has linked closely with our new computing module: online safety.

We have made great progress in Design and Technology this week – the sewing has commenced and I have been really impressed with their running stitch skills!

This week in English, we've continued our exploration of persuasive writing through the text, 'Perfect Parrot for Sale.' We delved into the vocabulary from the original piece, discovering and exploring a range of synonyms for key words. Building on this, we applied our newly acquired vocabulary in some short burst writing tasks. To round off the week, students designed their own persuasive posters for a pet shop, advertising the 'Perfect Parrot.'

In maths this week, we have moved onto our statistics unit, with a focus on pictograms. We have learned how crucial the key is for accurately reading and interpreting the data presented in a pictogram.
