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Weekly Round Up

Pebbles

Pebbles have enjoyed practising for their Sports Day, they have listened really carefully and enjoyed all the fun games and races. They have particularly enjoyed learning the wiggle dance for their warm up!

Ladybirds

This week in Ladybirds we have listened to the story Oliver's Vegetables; we discussed and wrote about our own favourite vegetables. We wrote a list of the vegetables found in the garden. We have used lots of adjectives to describe fruit and vegetables and gave clues to our friends whilst they tried to work out which vegetable we had written about.

We have looked at the primary colours and explored colour mixing. We have thought about all the fruit and veg that make up the rainbow! We discussed how we should eat a balanced diet and that our healthy plates can include lots of colours.

In maths we estimated how many beads it would take before we sank the boat. we played games using 2 ten frames, we pulled out an animal and added the correct number of legs onto the ten frame, the first to fill was the winner. Lots of super counting exploring the patterns in numbers for example counting in 2s and 10s.

It has been assessment week in phonics; we have also looked at the formation of capital letters.

Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been busy publishing and illustrating their favourite stories from this year. The children all worked very hard to use their best Ibstone handwriting and even challenged themselves to write blurbs and an about the author page.

In mathematics, Year 1 have completed their unit on money. This week they looked at recognising notes and counting coins to make an amount. In Year 2, the children finished learning about time and practised describing different turns including full turns, half turns, quarter turns and three-quarter turns.

In DT, Woodland Class have worked hard to make their desert and ice buggies. The children each designed their buggies using warm and cool colours before drawing their designs onto cardboard tubes. The children also made their own axles and axle holders to make their buggies move.

Woodlands celebrated our own Hanukkah on Wednesday. We lit eight candles to represent the eight nights of Hanukkah and tasted latkes. Latkes are shredded potatoes and onions and fried in oil, to remind Jews of the miracle of the oil that lasted 8 days. We then enjoyed playing spin the dreidel and singing the dreidel song!

Kestrel Class

In English this week we have written our own innovations of the text. We had an array of persuasive ideas ranging from persuading parents to buy a pet guinea pig to persuading Mrs Long to get a school viper. We're not too sure how Zog and Pumpkin would feel about having to share their dog bed with a viper! The class have been working hard at using lots of exciting synonyms and using this as an opportunity to improve their Thesaurus skills.

In mathematics, the Nemos have been working on statistics; drawing and interpreting pictograms and bar charts. The Frogs have finished their unit on position and direction; describing and plotting and coordinates, and also translating shapes on a grid.

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In DT, we made our bridges this week. The children used their plans as a guide but as they started the process, they realised that some of their ideas needed to be adapted in order to better support the structure. We tested the bridges to see how much weight they could hold and it was surprising how strong some of them were!

Osprey Class

This week in English, Osprey Class have been preparing for Ibvest. We have been using different circus themed stimulus to write dramatic and emotive pieces of writing. We have also started reflecting on the past year, whilst looking ahead to the future: we now have letters written to ourselves which we will open this time next year, talking about their hopes and ambitions.

Our waistcoats have been coming along beautifully – buttons, embroidery and pockets have been this weeks focus and I am so impressed with the Ospreys perseverance in this unit! A huge thank you to our parent helper this week, we couldn't have finished the project without your support!

We have had some fantastically curious questions this week regarding PSHE. We have covered what to do in an emergency and have learnt how to apply DR ABC to assess a casualty. Luckily, we did not need to apply DR ABC during our PE lesson which involved planks and sit ups!
