## Weekly Round Up

### Pebbles

This week we have been talking about and exploring 2D shapes. The children have been encouraged to play freely with blocks, shapes and shape puzzles, finding and naming circles, triangles, squares and rectangles. They have also been using descriptive vocabulary such as straight, flat, curved etc to describe them.

Pebbles have enjoyed singing Hickory Dickory Dock and have used puppets to act out the song. They have made clock pictures and drawn a mouse to slide up and down the clock.

We have had lots of fun dancing and acting out Nursery Rhymes to music, there were lots of big smiles as they skipped up the hill pretending to be Jack and Jill! They also practised their sad faces as they pretended to be Humpty Dumpty falling off the wall.



### Ladybirds

In Ladybirds this week we have focused on the rhyme Hickory Dickory Dock. We had fun changing the rhyme with different times. We found out lots of interesting facts about mice and shared our knowledge about what we already knew. We all enjoyed being creative with making our own mice.

We have explored all our rhymes through music and responded through dance and movement.

In mathematics the focus has been on patterns, we have been out on a pattern hunt around the school taking pictures. We have continued patterns and created our own using colourful bears, sorting objects and natural materials.

In phonics the sounds of the week have been ck, e, u and r and our new tricky word is I.

Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been busy writing their innovated stories. The children have been working hard to use interesting adjectives and have been developing the use of their writer’s toolkit including capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

In mathematics, Year 1 have finished their unit on place value. This week the children have been learning to compare and order numbers within 10. Year 2 have also continued to work on place value and have been learning to compare objects and numbers.

In science, the children have been exploring the difference between wild animals and pets. We first talked about what makes an animal wild before discussing reasons for having a pet. The children then sorted animals into groups based on whether they would belong in the wild or whether they would be a pet.



Kestrel Class

In English this week, the children have been learning about the different techniques that authors can use to describe a setting and bring it to life. They identified these techniques in The Impossibly Possible Bookshop and in another text called Elf Road. They have also started planning and writing their own innovated version of The Impossibly Possible Bookshop.

In mathematics, Nemos have been looking at adding 1s across a 10 and adding 10s across a 100. We have been focusing on partitioning the second number and then bridging to the next 10 or 100. Frogs have started their unit of work on addition and subtraction. They have been looking at adding and subtracting 1s, 10s, 100s and 1000s to 4 digit numbers. They then moved onto recapping column addition and using this method to add pairs of 4 digit numbers.

During our ‘Explore’ lesson, the children have continued their research about their chosen animal in preparation for writing a fact file about the different animals.

In science this week, we recapped our investigation from last week and discussed our findings. The children wrote a conclusion explaining what they found and also discussed whether their predictions were correct.

In PSHE, we discussed some of the rights children have at school, with regards to their education and being happy. We then thought about that in order to have these rights all children also have some responsibilities to help everyone achieve these rights.

Osprey Class

This week in English we were researching a famous black person from history, because this month is Black History Month, and we wanted to celebrate their successes in life. We took notes and started to write the facts into a biography of their life. We are looking forward to publishing our biographies.

In mathematics we have been continuing our addition and subtraction topic. We have been thinking about how we can check our answers by doing the inverse operation.

In French, we made a mask so that we could do a show in French. Our masks gave us a bit more confidence to be able to have a conversation in French in front of our friends. Whilst we were making our masks, the other children went swimming, with Mrs Long.





Barn Owls

This week in English we have become news reporters. We pretended that a dragon had been sighted in Ibstone and New York. We planned and made a 'breaking news report'. We also wrote our own newspaper articles. Alongside this, we have also explored similes.



In mathematics, we have used tens frames to help us learn how to add ones not only to one digit numbers but to two digit numbers too. We have been adding through tens by adding first to the next multiple of ten and then adding on.
