Weekly Round Up

Pebbles

Pebbles have enjoyed listening to lots of stories this week, their favourite has been 'It's a Bear!' It has been a bear themed week and the children have been sorting bears into coloured groups, counting bears and comparing the size of bears! They have listened to 'Brown Bear' and have started to learn the story off by heart! They loved joining in with the repetitive language in the story.

They have painted some superb pictures of big brown bears eating blueberry pies!

Ladybirds

This week in Ladybirds we have been finding out about bears and comparing the different places that we might find them. We discussed which were our favourite and why. We have started to learn our T4W story We're Going on a Bear Hunt, using a story map, we are learning to recite it with actions to help! We individually put the story into a S story plan and then retold our story. We have had fun with collage and cutting and making our own bear masks. We have also retold the story whilst painting.

In mathematics the focus has been on numbers 4 and 5 learning to subitise, adding 1 more and finding different ways to represent 4 and 5 using shells and tiles.

In phonics we are reading a sentence everyday now, our sounds of the week are v, w, x and y and the tricky words were; and, has his, her.



Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been identifying features of instructions. This week, the children have been using time conjunctions to sequence steps from our model text 'How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth'. They have also been learning about 'bossy' verbs and have used these to write command sentences.

In mathematics, Year 1 have been learning to add numbers within 10 using tens frames and number lines. Year 2 have been learning to add by making 10 using practical resources and written methods.

In science, the children have been looking at how the environment is constantly changing. The children discussed ways in which humans have changed our environment such as deforestation, pollution and climate change. The children then worked together in small groups to complete a litter audit around our school site to record the impact that litter is having on local wildlife.

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In geography, the children have been learning about The Arctic and Antarctica. We looked at pictures of the polar regions and discussed what it would be like to live there. The children then worked in small groups to make posters about The Arctic and Antarctica including lots of interesting facts.



Kestrel Class

In English this week, we have continued to create the text map and then learn the text using it along with actions. The children have also been learning about some of the features that are used by writers in non-chronological reports. They have looked at how paragraphs and subheadings are used to organise their writing and learn how to use generalisers. These are words or phrases that describe how often or how many (such as occasionally and majority). The children finished the week by planning, writing and then filming a TV news report about the sighting of The River Unicorn on Ibstone Common.



In mathematics, Nemos have continued to consolidate their understanding of the written methods for addition and subtraction. Frogs have been calculating and comparing area by counting squares. They have then moved onto learning the 3 and 6 times table.

In topic this week, the children have completed their fact file about their chosen rainforest animal. We then looked in detail at The Amazon Rainforest and Sherwood Forest. We learnt about some of the animals and plants that could be found in each of these forests, as well as finding out about their location and size. The children then wrote about both of these forests, thinking about any similarities and differences.

Osprey Class


This week we have enjoyed looking at our new art topic – Retro- Futurism. We are looking forward to creating our own piece of art using mixed media, later in the term. In Science we are also learning about Space, which links nicely to our art topic.

In Geography we have started planning our double page spread about our chosen capital cities in North America, so that we can compare it with London and decide where we would prefer to live.

This week we have been learning about persuasive language in English, whilst reading our new text map about Anmore Forest. Also, we have been working towards making our own brochure of Camp Green Lake, based on the Juvenile Detention Centre in Holes. We are going to have to work very hard to persuade people to visit it but we are looking forward to it.

In mathematics we are continuing our topic of fractions. We have been thinking about how to convert mixed fractions into improper fractions.

Our class reading challenge - The Triathlon - has been completed by a few of the children this week, with the rest of the class hoping to receive their certificate next week.



Barn Owls

This week we have continued our work on multiplication and division. We have mainly concentrated on the three times table and are getting very good at counting in threes. We explored the methods of sharing and grouping to divide numbers. We have looked at how multiplication and division are linked to each other.

In English, we were excited to hear our story, although 'Nail Soup' did not sound as nice as the soups we tasted last week! We learnt about how a traveller made a delicious soup claiming it was 'nail soup' yet he added many ingredients courtesy of the lady he was staying with. The soup not only created a lovely meal but also taught us the importance of sharing a meal and interesting conversation together. We used action to help us remember the sequence of the story.
