As we are now into the depths of winter, we thought it would be useful to share the kit ALL children should have in school for Forest School each week.



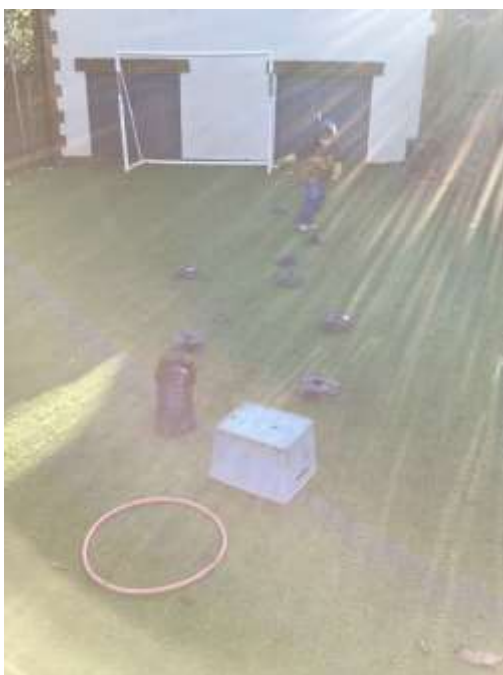
Winter kit

- * Ski trousers/ fleece lined waterproof trousers

- * Warm waterproof gloves
- * Ski jacket / warm waterproof coat (this is not their school coat, this is one that can be bagged up wet and muddy after the session)
- * Warm waterproof gloves
- * Wellies with extra socks to keep feet warm or walking boots
- * A warm hat
- * A named plastic bag for putting all the wet/ dirty kit in after the session.

Please could we ask that all children have their school coat in school with them on Forest School days AND a pair of shoes that they can wear before/after their Forest School session.

Weekly Round Up

Ladybirds

This week we have been very busy getting ready for our Nativity. We finished our topic 'on the farm' with thinking about what job we might like to do and why. I think the most popular jobs were looking after the baby animals and driving the tractor. We all used our phonics to add some writing to our picture. We have played games to match the mummy with the baby, learning the names of these animals.

In mathematics we have been thinking about 4 sided shapes, thinking about the properties of these and sorting accordingly. We have also found shapes within shapes.

In phonics we have reviewed all sounds to date and learnt to add an 's' to plurals even though sometimes it sounds like a z. Our new tricky words are we, me and be.

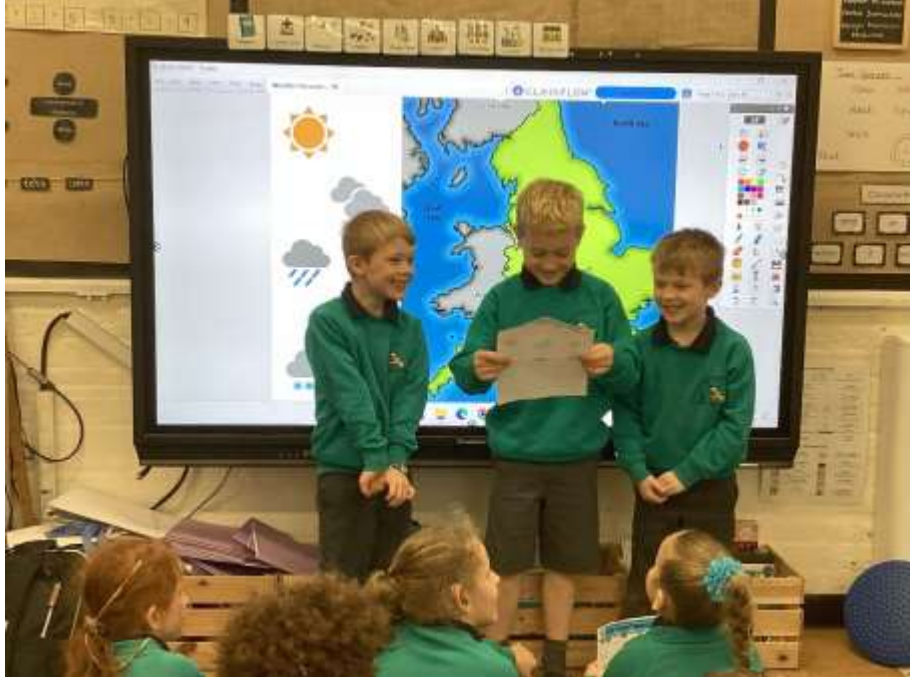


Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class been learning about features of persuasive leaflets. This week we have been looking at carefully choosing adjectives to persuade our readers e.g. amazing, spectacular, incredible. Year 2 were also challenged to use a thesaurus to find synonyms for words. The children have also learnt about alliteration to make things sound good e.g. 'sensational sweet shops' and 'fantastic fun rides'.

In mathematics, Year 1 have completed their work on addition and subtraction and have started learning about shape. This week, the children were introduced to 3D shapes and went on a shape hunt around school to find shapes such as cones, spheres, cubes and cuboids. Year 2 have been learning to add and subtract two 2-digit numbers. We have been learning pictorial methods to help us add and subtract the tens and ones in numbers.

In science, we learned about the weather and seasonal changes in winter. The children then worked in small groups to create a winter weather report.



Kestrel Class

In computing we have been looking at coding instructions. In pairs we followed some instructions for meeting a friend, identified which was the best order for the different commands and, if there were any issues, how could we solve them?

In maths we did a mystery square investigation which encouraged a systematic approach to solve the puzzle. Some great teamwork skills were demonstrated!

In English we continued writing our innovated version of the focus text and thought of some inventive equipment to catch our mythical creature. We also finished our class reader, Charlotte's Web, and are looking forward to starting our next class book.

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Osprey Class

This week in English we have been writing recounts from different characters' perspectives. We have used Fantastic Mr. Fox and the Grinch as inspiration. The children have been using fronted adverbials of time, rhetorical questions and paragraphs to help bring their diary entries to life.

In mathematics, Y5 and Y6 have continued to look at fractions and have completed their end of term assessments.

In science this week we have continued to look at irreversible changes. We made casein plastic by adding vinegar to warm milk. The acid (vinegar) causes the proteins in the milk to stick together creating casein plastic. Historically casein plastic has been used to make buttons, jewellery, knitting needles and other items. We moulded our casein plastic to create buttons, which we hope to decorate next week.



Barn Owls

In mathematics, we have continued our work on developing our multiplication skills. We learned to count in eights, with the help of a very catchy song. We have applied this to writing multiplication facts and solving word problems involving the eight times tables.

For English, we completed our texts 'How to Trap a Tooth Fairy'. The imagination was wonderful to see with the children using a fantastic balance of magpieing ideas alongside generating creative vocabulary of their own.

Family Hub Network

We are delighted to inform you that we have joined the Family Hub Network. This service enables us to connect the school and our families to a number of support networks, courses and appropriate help and enables us to access training for staff so that they can also lead on parenting courses and workshops to support our wider community.
