Weekly Round Up

Ladybirds

This week in Ladybirds we have been finding out all about our bodies and all the wonderful things they can do, we discovered the changes and how they felt after we exercised. We enjoyed different Funny Bones stories and had a go at chalking skeletons. We looked at xrays and identified the different bones in the body. We had fun singing head, shoulders, knees and toes super-fast! We estimated how many bodies we could fit on a very big piece of paper and drew around our bodies adding in our features.

We have enjoyed decorating our names. We have thought about different emotions and times we have felt like this. In small groups we decorated our own emotion jars.

We have continued sorting in maths exploring different criteria. Our sounds of the week in phonics are l, n, m, d. We have started to segment and blend cvc words.



Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been learning to retell our Talk 4 Writing text 'Augustus and His Smile' using actions. We have been learning to use adjectives to describe a setting and prepositions to describe where an object is within a setting.

In mathematics, Year 1 have been counting backwards within 10 and have been using their counting skills to help them find one more and one less than a given number. Year 2 have been learning to flexibly partition numbers to 100 and have been writing numbers in expanded form.

In science, Woodland Class have been exploring their sense of hearing. This week, the children took part in an investigation to listen to different sounds. After listening to the sounds, we wrote down what we thought the sound was and thought about a word to describe the sound e.g. loud, pleasant, buzzing.

As part of our Discover unit, this week we learnt about Florence Nightingale and why she was significant. We looked at key events in her life and wrote down interesting facts about her.



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Kestrel Class

In English this week we have been doing lots of short burst writing. The class have used adjectives and expanded noun phrases to describe their portal doors. They have also come up with different ways to change the setting, and used abstract nouns to create some exciting new worlds.

In mathematics, both Nemos and Frogs have continued to work on place value. Nemos have been comparing and estimating numbers to 1,000, using number lines. Frogs have been ordering numbers to 10,000 and have now moved onto Roman numerals

In history, we have been learning about cave paintings and art during the Stone Age. The class looked at cave paintings in different countries, discussed the materials that the people during that time would have used, and created their own fantastic paintings using paints and pastels.

As part of our work on collaborative learning and communication we did the drawing exercise 'exquisite corpse' which prompted a valuable conversation on the importance of clarity in communication. In Science we explored the North and South Poles and how they attract and repel.



Osprey Class

This week in English, Osprey Class have been working on describing settings through the main character's perspective; we have looked at a multitude of different settings, ranging from a coral reef, to a rainforest, to Harry Potter's dining hall. We have also been reinforcing our text map through charades and freeze frame activities.

This week in art we have finalised our Paul Nash inspired oil pastel pieces. The children have layered colours, shapes and shading to create an emotive landscape that reflects what Paul Nash experienced during the war.

In history we have been discussing life on the home front, with a particular focus on women, children, rationing and propaganda! In computing we have begun to look at how code cracking was an essential development in our current modern day computer models. We have been learning how to apply acrostic and pig pen code and Caesar, Nth letter and date shift ciphers.

Both Year 5 and 6 have been rounding numbers up to 100,000 this week in maths. We have also been working on number lines, calculating interval values and ordering numbers in ascending and descending order up to 1,000,000.



Barn Owls

The Barn Owls have been building their understanding of three-digit numbers this week, focusing on ordering them accurately. They needed to pay close attention to place value, especially when the hundreds digit was the same. We also started counting in 50s, linking this skill back to the familiar pattern of counting in 5s.

Our short burst writing sessions continued, with pupils innovating parts of our class text, Elf Road. They used their imaginations to explore different portal doors and described the exciting worlds they imagined lying beyond them.

Other important information:

Lunch bands

The children who have school lunches are given a band at lunch time to help staff know what they have ordered. There are blue bands for the main meal, green bands for jacket potatoes, red bands for school sandwiches and yellow bands for vegetarians/ dietary requirements.



We seem to have lost a huge amount of the blue bands since the start of term... please could you have a look at home to see if any have accidentally arrived for dinner!
