

This week in Family Time we listened to another 'Wemmicks' story by Max Lucado. We heard the story of 'Best of All' which is about celebrating our unique talents. We thought about our many talents and cut out a star and drew/wrote something that we are good at which will be used as a display in the hall.

Weekly Round Up

Pebbles

In Pebbles we follow the Little Wandle Foundations for Phonics. This week we have started the Turning into Sounds programme with short sessions everyday. This week our focus was the sound "S". We had fun playing what sound is in the box, finding different pictures and objects beginning with S and making up silly sentences to help us learn the sound.

The children have learnt a fabulous Fireworks song "Bonfire night is here". After learning the words to the song we then added dance actions including star jumps for the whooshing rockets and tip toes for the quiet, sparkly fountains. We used different coloured scarves for the pretty spinning catherine wheels. We then had great fun playing instruments while we sang, with loud drum beats for the big bangs and bells for the fizzing fireworks.

We also made some lovely bright explosive paintings.

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Ladybirds

It was lovely to see all the children back with big smiles and independently organising their coats and bags. We started the week listening to the story of The Little Red Hen and we all made head bands for the characters of the story. This is our focus story which we will use for Talk 4 Writing over the next three weeks. We have started to learn the story off by heart using a story map and learning some actions. We have used story props to retell the story.

In mathematics our focus has been on shape. We have been circle and triangle detectives. We have sorted shapes, made pictures and had fun going on a shape hunt. We discovered lots more circles around our school than triangles. We have also been thinking about how to describe the position of objects.

In phonics our new sounds were, ll, ff, ss and j our tricky words of the week are; put, pull, full, and as. During our phonics sessions we have now started to read sentences and spell different cvc words.



Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have started learning about instruction writing. This term the children will be writing instructions based on a recipe from George's Marvellous Medicine. On Wednesday, we started reading the story of George's Marvellous Medicine and made our own bubbling potions by following a set of instructions.

In mathematics, Year 1 have been busy learning their number bonds to 10 in a variety of ways. We have been using systematic methods as well as counters and tens frames to find pairs of numbers. Year 2 have continued learning about related facts and have been using their number bonds to 10 to help them find bonds to 100.

On Thursday, Woodland class enjoyed their history day set in the Victorian Times. We enjoyed learning interesting facts about Florence Nightingale and were also introduced to Mary Seacole who we will be learning about this half term. The children also enjoyed making their own lanterns and used dip pens and ink to write application forms to help at the hospital. We also made diaries, herb bags and medals for the soldiers fighting in the war.



Kestrel Class

In English, Kestrel Class have been writing their diary recounts about Josh and his adventures to the magic laboratory. It was important to make sure that it was written from the point of view of the first person, which was actually harder than expected. We kept discussing using the correct tense as well to make sure that the diary made sense.

In mathematics, Nemos have continued working on addition and subtraction, subtracting two numbers across 10 and across 100. Frogs have finished area and moved on to multiplication and division, working on multiples of 3.

We had a fantastic day of history on Thursday! It was great fun all getting dressed up and pretending that we were living in the Stone Age. The class made clay coil pots and a clay tablet with some letters from the Cuneiform alphabet inscribed. They did some weaving and also made a small 'cave' using Modroc and painted some cave art onto it. The other activities were soap carving and also making a foil stater after learning about money. It was a really immersive experience and a great day of learning for all of us!



Osprey Class

Osprey Class have continued learning about World War 1 & 2 this week. They have listened to War Poetry and discussed how Wilfred Owen's choice of words created such imagery. They have also been learning Lest we Forget for our Remembrance Worship next week. We all thoroughly enjoyed our History Off the Page day on Thursday and found out more about life on the Home Front in WW2. We all had the chance to make an ID card, dip pen, ARP badge, gas mask box, toy plane, cipher wheel for secret messages and a pom pom.



In mathematics, Year 5 have continued their work from before half term and explored common factors. This led nicely into their work on prime numbers, learning that all prime numbers have two factors. They have also looked at square numbers. Year 6 have continued their work on multiplication and division and applying their skills in problem solving. They have also looked at the order of operations learning the order of priority for operations in a calculation: that calculations in brackets should always be done first, and that multiplication and division have equal priority and should be performed before additions and subtractions.

In science this week we have started our topic on the changes of materials by exploring evaporation. We were presented with a problem – we are marooned on a desert island and we are in need of a drink. We have 2 bottles with us, one contains pure water and the other contains a salt water solution. How can we find out which is the drinking water (without tasting them!)? We have begun our investigation into evaporation and will observe our two cups containing the substances over the coming days.

Barn Owls

In mathematics, we've been focusing on our subtraction skills. We started by practising the subtraction of single-digit numbers from numbers up to 20. This practice was key to building confidence before moving on to more complex tasks. The children are now able to work column subtraction problems that require an exchange.

In English, we used the structure of Poppy's Diary—which we explored before the holiday—to inspire our own creative writing. The children fully embraced writing from the perspective of Josh, recounting his incredible adventure through a huge science lab. Their focus was mastering the use of the first person and consistent past tense, ensuring their diary entries included descriptive language and exciting detail.
